SUNDAY'S SCRIPTURES

This weekend, we read from *Zechariah 9: 9 & 10; Romans 8: 9 to 13; and Matthew 11: 25 to 30*. Next week, on the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, our Scripture readings are drawn from *Isaiah 55: 10 & 11Z; Romans 8: 18 to 23; and Matthew 13: 1 to 23*.

ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

Born in the Iroquois fortress of Ossernenon near present-day Auriesville, New York, Kateri was the daughter of a Mohawk chief and a Roman Catholic Algonquin captive. When she was four, small-pox decimated her village. She was orphaned and left with unsightly facial scars and poor eyesight. She was adopted by her uncle, a chief of the Turtle Clan. Many young men sought to marry her, in spite of her disfigurement, because it would make for a powerful political connection. During this time she took an interest in Christianity but her uncle forbade conversion. In 1666, the French destroyed Ossernenon. Sympathetic Christian Mohawks helped her escape to a settlement across the Mohawk River, near what is now the the Village of Fonda. There, at age 20, she was baptized on Easter Sunday, April 18, and took the name *Kateri*, (pronounced more like “*Gat- el- ye*”) the Mohawk rendering of the French Catherine. Because she was persecuted by her non-Christian kin, she fled to a community of Native American Christians in Kahnawake, Quebec, where she lived a life dedicated to prayer, penance and care for the sick. In 1679, she took a vow of chastity. A year later, on April 17, 1680, Kateri died at the age of 24. Her last words are said to have been, “Jesus, I love you.”



This sketch depicts her holding a cross such as the missionaries fashioned. She is surrounded by her symbol, for she is called the "Lily of the Mohawks." Above her head is the symbol of her Turtle Clan. This clan crosses tribal lines throughout the Eastern United States, so there were Turtle Clan people among the Leni-Enape in our valley.
