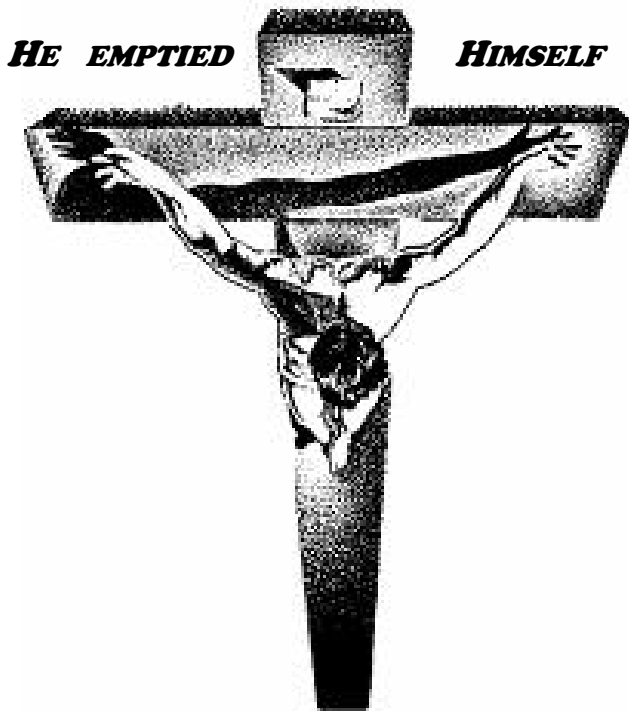

**SUNDAY'S SCRIPTURES**

This weekend is the Twenty-sixth Week of Ordinary Time. The word "Ordinary" ( with a capital "O" ), does not mean "usual" or "plain" as opposed to "rare" or "unexpected." It means "following an order," a structure -- in this case, a calendar. We will read from *Ezekiel 18: 25 to 28*; *Philippians 2: 1 to 11*; and *Matthew 21: 28 to 32*. The passage from *Philippians* is one of the most famous and beloved in all of New Testament scripture. Next Sunday, the Twenty-seventh in Ordinary Time, the readings will be taken from *Isaiah 5: 1 to 7*; *Philippians 4: 6 to 9*; and *Matthew 21: 33 to 43*.
