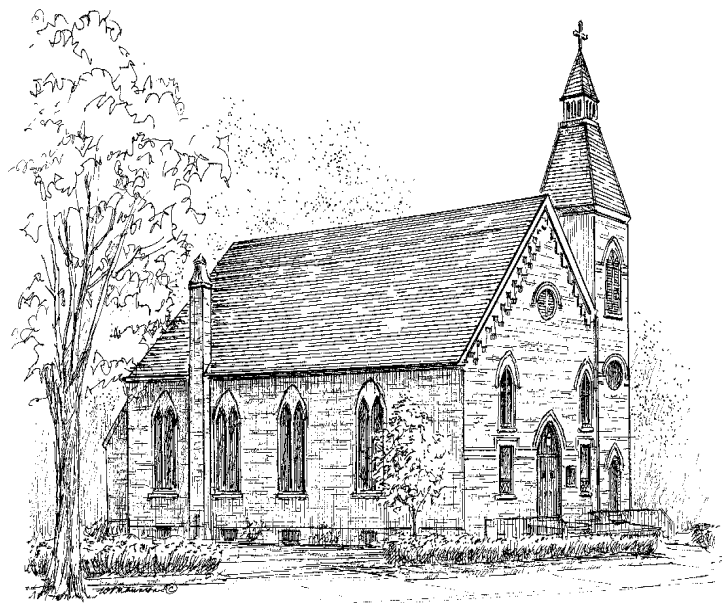

VETERANS' DAY - HEROES & SAINTS

The observance of Veterans' Day in the United States has its roots in the the armistice that ended World War I, on the 11th day of the 11th month, at the 11th hour. President Wilson proclaimed thereafter that November 11 be observed as "Armistice Day." In 1954, Congress renamed it "Veterans' Day." Since the Civil War, only five military chaplains -- all of them



Catholic -- have received the Medal of Honor. Two of them are "Servants of God," the first step toward canon-ization as saints:

Father Emil Kapaun, an Army chaplain from Kansas, died as a prisoner of war in Korea. Father Vincent Capodanno, a Maryknoll priest born on Staten Island, died while attempting to rescue Marines

from the field of battle in Vietnam. The Navy named the *USS Capodanno* after him.

The remaining three also have heroic stories. Father Joseph O'Callahan, a Jesuit priest and Navy chaplain in World War II, ministered to injured sailors on a ship hit by two bombs. He worked to jettison bombs close to exploding and led a dangerous mission to water down other ammunition hot enough to explode. The Navy named the *USS O'Callahan* after him. Father Charles J. Watters, from New Jersey, served in Vietnam. He ran through intense gunfire to rescue wounded men at the Battle of Dak To. On another occasion, though injured himself, he moved about, applying bandages and giving food and water to others. He died in the worst "friendly-fire" incident in Vietnam when he and 41 others were hit by shrapnel from a 500-pound bomb. Father Angelo "Charles" Liteky, won his medal for carrying 20 wounded soldiers to safety during intense fighting on a search and destroy mission in Vietnam. Afterwards he became a peace activist, left the priesthood in 1975, and renounced his medal in 1986. It is on display at the National Museum of American History.

Attendance at the All Saints' Day Masses was only 85, better than it's been for the last two years. The Offertory Collection was up over \$ 500 from the average.

While still below average, it matched that of the previous three years for the first week-end of November. And last weekend's Offertory almost exactly matched that of 2014 for the highest of the last five years.

THE "GIVING TREE" RETURNS NEXT WEEK



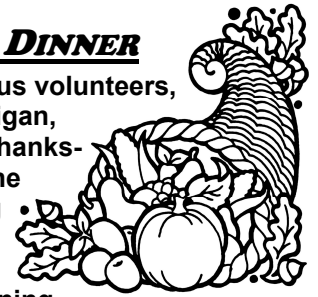
